Passage 1

When 14-year-old Carlos noticed his Nairobi neighborhood flooding every rainy season, he decided

to take action. Using discarded plastic bottles and pipes from local markets, the Kenyan teen created a rainwater filtration(过滤) system in 2021. His first prototype(原型), built on his family's roof, could store 200 liters of clean water during storms.

Carlos's science teacher Ms. Atieno recognized his talent and helped him apply for a youth innovation **grant**. With the \$500 funding, Carlos improved his design using mosquito (蚊子) nets as filters and bicycle tires as sealing rings (密封圈). By 2022, his "Raindrop" devices were installed on 15 community buildings, providing emergency water for 300 families during droughts.

The project faced challenges when some filters blocked by leaves. Carlos improved the filter design by adding removable mesh(网) layers, inspired by his mother's kitchen sieve(筛子). His younger sister Grace then suggested painting the tanks with weatherproof art, turning functional devices into neighborhood decorations.

In 2023, Carlos's invention won the African Young Inventors Award. He now leads workshops teaching other teens to build affordable water systems. "Every simple invention counts," Carlos says. "Just like every young person can make a difference."

Passage 2

In a small Beijing studio, 28-year-old artist Li Ming blends centuries-old paper-cutting with modern technology. His journey began in 2018 while studying China's intangible heritage(非物质文化遗产). Attracted by Shanxi's 1,500-year-old shadow puppet (皮影戏) traditions, Li wondered: "Could paper art become interactive?"

For two years, Li tried backlit(背光的) installations. Using laser-cut (激光切割) Xuan paper and LED lights, he created scenes from Beijing's hutongs(胡同) that glow differently when viewed from various angles. His breakthrough came in 2020 with "Moon Gate Memories" — a 3-meter artwork showing a traditional courtyard that changes from dawn to midnight as viewers walk past. "Each piece has 48 paper layers," Li explains. "The thinnest is 0.1mm, requiring 200 accurate cuts." His tools mix old and new: handmade bamboo knives for delicate patterns, 3D printers for structural frames.

Museums worldwide now display Li's works. In 2023, he launched workshops teaching teenagers to make "light paintings". Student Zhang Yu recently created a digitalized version of the classic "Magpie on Plum Branch" that reacts to smartphone flashes. "Tradition isn't frozen," Li says. "It's a river we keep flowing."

Passage 4

Be aware of those who use the truth to cheat. When someone tells you something that is true, but leaves out important information that should be included, he can create a false impression. For example, someone might say, "I just won a hundred dollars on the lottery. It was great. I took that dollar ticket back to the store and changed it for one hundred dollars!"

This guy's a winner, right? Maybe; maybe not. We then discover that he bought two hundred tickets, and only one was a winner. He's really a big loser!

He didn't say anything that was false, but he deliberately left out some important information. That's called a half-truth. Half-truths are not technically lies, but they are just as dishonest.

Untrustworthy candidates in political campaigns often use this strategy. Let's say that during Governor Smith's last term, her state lost one million jobs and gained three million jobs.

Now she is seeking another term. One of her opponents runs an advertisement saying, "During Governor Smith's term, the state lost one million jobs!" That's true. However, an honest statement would have been, "During Governor Smith's term, the state had a net gain of two million jobs."

Advertisers will sometimes use half-truths. It's against the law to make false claims so they try to mislead you with the truth. An advertisement might boast, "Nine out of ten doctors recommend Yucky Pills to cure nose pimples." It fails to mention that they only asked ten doctors and nine of them work for the Yucky Corporation.

This kind of **deception** happens too often. It's a sad fact of life: Lies are lies, and even truths can deceive.
